Appendix 3 – Managing Travel in Special Schools

The following are some of the tasks/responsibilities associated with managing travel to Special Schools:

- Managing escort rosters and substitutes
- Route planning with Bus Éireann
- Contracts and other HR issues
- Dangerous behaviour and other Health and Safety issues on vehicles harnesses, hoists, booster seats, seatbelt issues, wheelchair access etc. Some routes are very long and the management of combinations of pupils who pose a risk to others, yet are accommodated on the same school bus, becomes an issue for the principal.
- Escort training client lifting, epilepsy, diabetes, First Aid, behaviour management
- Medical emergencies on vehicles
- Dealing with parental complaints/expectations
- Liaising with up to 20 drivers and Bus Éireann management to solve problems. Bus Éireann's new tendering process means that drivers and vehicles (and therefore the allocation of escorts) are constantly changing, which is distressing to pupils.
